Trail work included clearing brush, establishing proper footing on switchback areas for safe passage. The steep wash out areas were filled with dirt and brush to prevent further erosion.



Time was spent on old erosion wash areas by filling steep gullies with earth & brush, while creating water run off channels away from the new switchback trail.
