Q5 GLASSIER EQUESTRIAN TRAIL (horses & hikers only)

High demand for equestrians as the parking is acceptable for trucks and trailers

The uphill departure from the Parking Lot is a hot climb due to the sunny exposure

Trail is good for types of riders and horses

GLASSIER - What the RFVHC learned

- The horse trailer turn around can be improved
- Better latches on gates
- Used more often in the spring and late fall
- High scrub oak landscape – not a high alpine ride
- We have heard that the mountain bikers want to use the Glassier hiker and equestrian trail as a one way access on Glassier – can the equestrians and hikers ask for a trails use commitment from the PC OST?
- RFOV has Glassier Open Space on their barbed wire removal list of work to do in 2022

In the works - solutions with PC OST

- Survey Monkey Responses and Summary will begin new conversations with PC OST
- Introduce the PC OST to the ELCR's Safe Passing Action Plan and RFVHC's Yield signage, which is gaining national attention. RFVHC asks PC OPST to share the Plan with Community in monthly Newsletters
- Continue to promote the Glassier to the Divide Parking Lot Ride for full day outings and vice versa
- Funding is being sought for 2022-23-24 trail projects and working grants with the PC OST, RFTA & Mid Valley Trails Committee for trail improvements. RFVHC asks that the RFVHC be listed in the 2022-23 funding budget
